Part V

Notes

I felt that the election committee worked really well and was nice to have support when dealing with issues. I also made use of the student electoral officer on voting days to help police the library and Riddell.

Complaints

Several reports were received on March 20th 2018 of a candidate soliciting votes and actively campaigning in both the library and Kisik towers. Not only does this break the rule of active campaigning on voting days but these are also areas designated no campaigning zones. Further to that soliciting votes can affect the outcome of the election. According to the bylaw, interference or attempted interference with the voting process is worth 20 demerit points. Further to this, the candidate failed to turn in expense forms on time which is worth 8 demerit points. The election committee conducted a thorough investigation following these reports and concluded that the candidate had broken several bylaws which resulted in an accumulation of 28 demerit points and disqualified from the election. There is a separate Election committee report for this matter.

Another complaint that I received during the election that was of a concerning nature was regarding someone campaigning within URSU premises which would be seen to give them an unfair advantage. A photo of a candidate holding alleged campaign material behind the front desk was sent to me by another candidate. This photo however did not come directly from the candidate that was complaining but was sent to him to be forwarded to me. There was no statement to support that the complainants had seen this campaign material being handed out nor was the picture clear enough to show that it was in fact campaign material. I did however

talk with the candidate in question about this offence and when considering all the evidence I was satisfied that no bylaw had been broken. I have received further complaints from the complaining candidate since that I did not take this matter seriously but as there were no statements provided from witnesses stating that this alleged campaign material had been handed out, I felt I had no basis on which to pursue this investigation further.

There were several demerit points awarded during this campaign but no further penalties. Candidates were quick to report on each other, and at times I felt that this was done in a way that suggested they were telling me how to do my job. Further, candidates seemed to want me to tell them if I was going to punish other candidates which I felt was unacceptable. A large number of candidates failed to turn in their expense forms, even though a reminder was sent a week prior, and for this they received 8 demerit points. Instead of issuing any further penalties I decided that any expenses received past the deadline would not be reimbursed.

Recommendations

- The campaign week should be reduced from two weeks to one week. Commencing on a Monday and ending the following Monday with 2 voting days to follow. A week should be left between the end of nominations and the start of campaigning. This gives the candidates sufficient time to get their campaign material to the CRO and gives the CRO sufficient time to review everything. This first week would be better spent promoting the election and announcing the candidates.
- The SEO could be given more of a role such as organising the voting stations and poll clerks during the election. This would enable the CRO to focus on the candidates.
- I would recommend that a manual is made for any future CRO. This was the second time I have carried out this role but I still felt there were things that I could have done better if things were set out a bit more clearly. This could be added to as problems arise from year to year.
- I would recommend having more than one All Candidates Forum. I was not aware that the previous year forums had been held in the FNUniv also, but I feel like this would be a good thing to have written into the bylaw to encourage participation in the elections from our other campuses.
- There were a few issues with candidate profiles arriving on time. The bylaw states that candidates have until the first day of campaigning whereas the nomination package said the final day of nominations. No penalties were issued for this based on this reason but this inconsistency should be rectified.
- Another problem regarding the demerit system was the All Candidates Forum. Failure
 to attend resulted in 5 demerit points according to the bylaw however this was difficult
 to administer. Some positions were unopposed and some of the people who ran opposed
 could not attend due to midterms. I did not penalise anyone for not attending this time
 as there was no way to be consistent. Something that may want to be considered in the
 future.
